Prop 133: Protecting Partisan Primaries

Requires partisan primary elections for partisan offices



Prop 134: Geographic Distribution

Citizen initiatives must collect signatures from every legislative district statewide ensuring all areas of the state are represented



Prop 135: Reining in Emergency Powers

Gives the legislature ability to limit or terminate Governor's emergency powers



Prop 136: Pre-Election Initiative Challenges

Ability to challenge initiatives before they reach the ballot



Prop 137: Judicial Retention

Judges up for retention only if they don't meet judicial performance standards or are convicted of a crime



Prop 138: Tipped Wage Protection

Protects food service industry allowing employers to pay less than minimum wage when employees earn tips



Prop 139: Abortion Access Amendment

Establishes the fundamental right to abortion up to viability (www.itgoestoofar.com)



Prop 140: Jungle Primaries / Ranked Choice Voting

Imports CA style primaries and potentially limits voters' partisan choices; complicates voting

Withdrew

Prop 212: Minimum Wage Hike

Increases min wage to \$18; eliminates ability for employers to pay tipped employees below the minimum wage; small biz, food industry killer



Prop 311: First Responder Death Benefit

Creates a state \$250,000 benefit in addition to federal \$500,000 to families when death occurs in the course of work



Prop 312: Protecting Property Owners

Allows property owners to apply for property tax refund if the municipality does NOT enforce laws regarding illegal camping, loitering, panhandling, etc., i.e., the "zone" in Phoenix



Prop 313: Life Sentences for Child Sex Traffickers

Anyone convicted of a class 2 felony child sex trafficking automatically receives sentence of natural life without possibility of release or parole



Prop 314: Securing the Border

Enables state / local police to arrest noncitizens who cross the border illegally (similar to Texas SB4)



Prop 315: Agency Rulemaking Oversight

Requires legislative ratification before an Agency (administrative) rule which is estimated to cost \$500,000 can go into effect



Prop 479: Maricopa County Transit Tax

Extends ½ cent sales tax for 20 years to fund \$64B transportation plan which includes road diets, rapid transit bus lanes, street cars, and light rail expansion. Ultimately adds to traffic congestion
